WHEREAS, it is estimated that the geologic rock bed known as Marcellus Shale may contain up to several trillion cubic feet of natural gas and drilling, and

WHEREAS, dramatic increases in the price of crude oil and the corresponding need to reduce our nation's dependence on foreign oil have resulted in a tremendous increase in interest and activity relating to natural gas exploration and drilling, and

WHEREAS, municipalities in which natural gas drilling is proposed should be consulted regarding natural gas permit applications and the comments of municipalities should be considered and given significant weight when determinations relating to natural gas permit applications are made,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Smithville requests that the Department of Environmental Conservation promulgate regulations to require that local governments be designated as involved agencies for the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) proceedings relating to natural gas permit applications for the proposed sites within the boundaries of the local governments and that local governments' views be solicited and given significant weight when determinations relating to natural gas permit applications are made, and be it further

RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution shall be forwarded to Governor David Paterson, Senator Thomas W. Libous, Assemblyman Clifford W. Crouch and Commissioner Alexander B. Grannis, New York State Department of Environmental Conservation.

NB2: Local Law consideration for Town Road logging, drilling use

A copy of a local law from the Town of German was introduced for Town Board consideration. This local law regulates the use of German Town roads by companies and/or individuals seeking commercial pursuits in logging, stone selling, mineral extraction, gas drilling etc. and seeks to prevent damage to Town roads. An operations permit is required and penalties are provided for non-compliance. Board members were interested in pursuing this as a similar Local Law for the Town of Smithville. Supervisor Johnson will contact Attorney Monaco with the sample copy of German's local law for his opinion. It will be discussed again in September as Old Business.

NB3: Enforcement Officer concern re: Holding Tanks

Enforcement Officer Neal Root was recognized by the Board to update them on the status of holding tanks. These were originally thought NOT to be allowed. The Enforcement Officer had sent a letter to the NYS Bureau requesting clarification. They in turn replied to Mr. Kaiser of the Chenango County Environmental Office. It has been determined that holding tanks ARE allowed under certain conditions. Enforcement Officer Root would like to create a holding tank information sheet showing NYS guidelines to add to the Town of Smithville septic application and which will stipulate the conditions under which a holding tank may be used. Mr. Kaiser will continue to look for more documentation. Supervisor Johnson will discuss the situation with Attorney Monaco.

NB4: Town Highway Employees budgetary concerns

The four Town Highway employees approached the Board with concerns about wages for the 2009 Budget and the Employee Guidelines package. Their concerns were:

- 1.) They would like to have a \$2.00 per hour increase for 2009 and then a yearly % after that. This would bring them more in line with other Towns.
- 2.) Increase sick days from the current 7 to 12.
- 3.) Introduce "Longevity pay". At 10 years of service an employee would receive a bonus of \$100.00 with a \$75.00 year added bonus for every year after that.
- 4.) Re-instate the Seniority status.
- 5.) Remove from the Guidelines package the "6 months of probation" for new hires. There were no decisions by the Board.

NB5: Gas Drilling Concerns

Ms. Carol Omalyev, Stone Quarry Hill Rd., was recognized and approached the Board to express her concerns over gas drilling occurring in the area. Drilling in the Tyner area has started again and other areas in Smithville have been tagged for drilling locations. The term "horizontal fracking" means drilling will occur horizontally in addition to the vertical channel initially drilled. Other areas allowing "horizontal fracking" have seen their land(s) severely impacted by shortages of water and other environmental issues. Ms. Omalyev's 2 particular concerns were over the loss of water and protection of small neighborhoods or neighborhoods in valleys in the area through perhaps zoning. Board members shared her concerns but had no immediate answers.
